### (A) Child Abuse Reporting Procedures (EC 35294.2 [A] [2]; PC 11166)

"Child Abuse" includes the following situations:

- a. A physical injury inflicted by other than accidental means on a child by another person.
- b. Sexual abuse of a child.
- c. Willful cruelty or unjustifiable punishment of a child, or willfully inflicting unjustifiable physical pain or mental suffering, or failure to safeguard a child from these injuries when the child is under a person's care or custody.
- d. Unlawful corporal punishment or injury resulting in a traumatic condition.
- e. Neglect of a child

### (B) Disaster Procedures (EC 35295-35297; GC 8607 And 3100)

To ensure the safety of all students, staff, and families, the following procedures are practiced routinely to facilitate a calm and orderly process for emergencies:

- 1. Fire Evacuation
- 2. Earthquake / Drop, Cover, and Hold
- 3. Lockdown / Intruder
- 4. Active Shooter
- 5. Shelter in Place / Hazards in the Air
- 6. Flood
- 7. Suicide Risk Assessment

### (C) School Suspension, Expulsion and Mandatory Expulsion Guidelines

Students who violate the California Education Code section 48900, who are seriously disrupting the educational process and/or presenting a health or safety threat may be suspended for up to five school days. YPSA will notify and confer with the student's parent or caregiver as detailed in the suspension procedures below. Furthermore, it will comply with the new law on suspension of students in grades K-6 pertaining to defiance of a valid authority specified in Ed Code Section 48900 subsection K and manifestation determination process for students with a 504 plan or Individual Education Plan (IEP).

- Suspension 24 areas
- Expulsion 5 areas
- Mandatory Expulsion 1 area

#### (D) Procedures To Notify Teachers Of Dangerous Pupils (EC 49079)

- Upon receipt of a new student's cumulative records, the health and safety coordinator is alerted and responsible for the administration of protocols, threat assessments, and case-staffing relative to dangerous students and behaviors. These are facilitated based on different scenarios.
- The nurse, psychologist, behavioral specialist, and educational specialist work closely to manage the school's most difficult students for a variety of risk factors using a restorative approach to mitigate any threatening behaviors.
- · The health and safety coordinator will communicate the information to the teachers.

### (E) Sexual Harassment Policies (EC 212.6 [B])

Federal law defines sexual harassment as unwelcome sexual conduct that is a term or condition of employment. The Equal Employment Opportunity Commission's Guidelines define two types of sexual harassment: "quid pro quo" and "hostile environment."

Sexual harassment may include, but is not limited to:

- · Physical assaults of a sexual nature
- Unwanted sexual advances, propositions or other sexual comments
- · Sexual or discriminatory displays or publications anywhere at the workplace by employees

(F) School-wide Dress Code Relating To Gang-related Apparel (EC 35183)

Make-up: Make-up, glitter, or extra-long nails are not allowed.

**Tops:** Polo shirts, t-shirts, or collared shirts can be worn by students. Shirts must touch the top of the pants. "Halter", "tube", "spaghetti straps," midriffs, and tank tops are not appropriate and cannot be worn to school. Emblems, words and/or pictures on clothing should be appropriate to the educational atmosphere.

**Bottoms:** Solid color pants, jeans, skirts, sweats, jumpers, or appropriate-length shorts can be worn by students. Shorts, skirts, dresses must be at least "fingertip" in length when arms are at their sides. Pants must fit around the waist. No saggy pants.

**Shoes:** Athletic shoes (tennis) or other closed-toe shoes will be worn by students at all times. No sandals or slippers allowed. Jackets, Coats, and Sweatshirts: All jackets, coats, and sweaters may be worn provided that they do not have any inappropriate symbols, obscenities, language or graphic references to drugs, alcohol or violence.

(G) Procedure For Safe Ingress And Egress Of Pupils, Parents, And Staff To And From School (EC 35294.2)

YPSA has procedures for safe ingress and egress of students, parents, and staff to and from the school in the event there is a need for evacuation.

(H) A Safe And Orderly School Environment Conducive To Learning (EC 35294.2)

Through a safety committee made-up of staff, administrators, and a law enforcement officer, the Principal and Assistant Principal are responsible for leading the staff and community in creating a school environment in which students come to school every day feeling safe, welcome, and ready to learn.

The staff will also teach and model the five Lifelong Guidelines: Trustworthiness, Truthfulness, Active Listening, No Put-Downs, and Personal Best. Staff members will also model and use the 19 LIFESKILLS.

The HET model, comprised of all 10 elements of body-brain compatible education is used to develop a learning environment absence of threat.

(I) School Discipline Rules And Consequences (EC 35291 And EC 35291.5)

Yav Pem Suab Academy (YPSA) understands that for students to be successful and productive, they have to be disciplined. Students must respect themselves, like themselves and be respected by others to succeed in today's world.

Integrated throughout the curriculum will be Lifelong Guidelines and the LIFESKILLS that lead students in living a Disciplined Life and experiencing success in all chosen endeavors. Students will continually visit these skills as they matriculate from grade to grade through the classroom and various school programs.

### (J) Procedures to Prepare for Active Shooters

An "active shooter" is an individual who is engaged in killing or attempting to kill people in a confined and populated area; in most cases, active shooters use firearms and there is no pattern or method to their selection of victims.

When an Active Shooter is in your vicinity, you must be prepared both mentally and physically to deal with the situation.

- Run
- 2. Hide
- 3. Fight

### (K) HATE CRIME REPORTING PROCEDURES AND POLICIES

In accordance with section 48900, if a student causes, threatens, attempt to causes, or participates in an act of hate violence defined as willfully interfering with or threatening another person's personal or property rights because of race, ethnicity, national origin, disability or sexual orientation and/or uses speech that threatens violence when the perpetrator has the apparent ability to carry out the threat, may be considered an act of hate violence.

A student may be suspended for up to five days; law enforcement may be contacted, and expulsion may be recommended.

### Procedures For Preventing Acts Of Bullying And Cyber-bullying

Indicators of bullying behavior at YPSA include, but are not necessarily limited to the following:

- Verbal: Hurtful name-calling, teasing, gossiping, making threats, making rude noises or spreading hurtful rumors.
- Nonverbal: Posturing, making gang signs, leering, staring, stalking, destroying property, using graffiti or graphic images or exhibiting inappropriate and/or threatening gestures or actions.
- Physical: Hitting, punching, pushing, shoving, poking, kicking, tripping, strangling, and hair-pulling, fighting, beating, biting, spitting, or destroying property.
- Emotional (Psychological): Rejecting, terrorizing, extorting, defaming, intimidating, humiliating, blackmailing, manipulating friendships, isolating, ostracizing, using peer pressure, or rating or ranking personal characteristics.
- Cyber-Bullying: Sending insulting or threatening messages by phone, e-mail, websites, or any other electronics or written communication.

### Safety Plan Review, Evaluation And Amendment Procedures

The Academy Council/School Site Council will review and evaluate the Safety Plan relevant to the needs and resources of Yav Pem Suab Academy. The council shall consult with local law enforcement and fire authorities in the writing and development of the plan (Education Code 35294.1, 35294.2). The School Site council may delegate the responsibility for writing and developing a school safety plan to a school safety planning committee.

The Academy Council/School Site Council shall evaluate, and amend as necessary, the safety plan at least once a year to ensure that the plan is properly implemented. (Education Code 35294.2). Emergency drills are planned and held at regular intervals throughout the school year. Following each drill, all staff receives notification regarding adherence to the protocol and what procedures are being amended based on problems discovered during the drill. This information is shared with the school site council or safety committee to use when reviewing, evaluating, and amending the school safety plan.
